Those old black and white movies of the cold war are stamped in my mind. At the end of the movie, in the dim fog someone walks across the bridge from captivity to freedom. Worship is like that. Those who truly enter into

worship make a weekly habit of walking out of the fog of their weekly activities into the presence of Almighty God.

Today you will find a special brochure in your Chronicles: A Bridge To Worship. Use it as a reminder of the steps you take to make worship genuine and powerful.

We have talked about the principles for several weeks now, but principles forgotten or neglected bring little power to our lives.
