2008-2009 Budget

Dear Church Family,

Your Stewardship Committee has sought to prayerfully and diligently prepare for you our budget recommendations for the fiscal year 2008-2009. This document is a blueprint for ministry for the coming year and we pray that the Lord will be honored and glorified by every step we take to move forward both here and around the world to reach people for our Lord Jesus.

We would like to highlight some of the particulars of this budget plan as we prepare to discuss it as a church family this Wednesday night:

1. The Missions Committee is recommending a 1% reduction in our Cooperative Program giving. This 1% would be redistributed to other missions efforts including an increase in our Acts 1:8 efforts of \$6,000; an increase of \$3,800 in benevolence, and \$4,361 to be sent to the International Mission Board. This change will not decrease our missions giving,



and our total missions budget as a percentage of our total budget will actually increase as a result of this change.

2. After reviewing our total budget situation, the Stewardship Committee felt that a 3% cost-of-living adjustment for our staff was available and the Personnel Committee concurred and is recommending this adjustment. The total personnel budget is decreased by 2.4% due to other cost saving measures

realized in the current year.

- 3. The \$15,000 reduction in the line item for cleaning service was realized through a new agreement with the company that provides this service. This provides the same level of high quality service which we have come to expect throughout our building.
- 4. Other reductions in budget items were achieved through looking at actual expenditures and our ministry team does not expect that any real need will go unmet.
- 5. The Capital Budget has been reduced to reflect the actual payments necessary to fund this debt. The total amount of this debt has been reduced during the past year to just over a million dollars but the committee would ask you to pray about giving over and above your current tithes and offerings to pay this debt as guickly as possible.

Prayerfully consider your giving in light of Biblical teaching and ask the Lord what He would have you do in this vital area of Christian living as we Encounter, Encourage, and Engage our surrounding area and the world. In Christ,
