skills in the lives of children, youth and families. Every person who participates has the opportunity to learn Bible books, verses, key passages, and divisions; Bible book content; Bible people; and life application. The hope is

to help children and youth have a real experience that leads to a strong personal connection with the Bible. It teaches them that the Bible is easy to use, that it is more than a book to use at church, and it helps to develop a love for the

Children's Bible Drill- There are three cycles of curriculum and each year the children use a different cycle. With each cycle, 1st-3rd grade learns 8 Bible verses and 10 Key Passages while 4th-6th grade learn 25 Bible verses and 10 Kev Passages. At the end of three years children in grades 1-3 will have had the opportunity to learn and apply 25 verses and 30 Key Phillip Passages. After participating for three years, older children will have had the opportunity to learn and apply at least 75 verses and 30 Key Passages. Both groups will learn all the books of the Bible.

Youth Bible Drill - grades 7th, 8th, and 9th While preparing for the drill, youth develop skills in using their Bibles - locating books and verses, memorizing passages, and Drill. locating passages dealing with

doctrinal and ethical concerns. Students increase their love for the Bible and will retain the scriptures they learn at a young age over their lifetime of ministry. It is a fun and easy way to develop Bible skills and memorize scripture.

Xtreme Bible Challenge - grades 10th, 11th, and 12th - is set up like Jeopardy, teams of three people learning and working together in studying different books of the Bible. Over the three years they examine I Timothy, II Timothy, Titus and Philemon. The Bible study is expository in nature; going verse by verse, word by word. Students gain a good understanding of church polity. The purpose of Xtreme Challenge is to ignite a fire, a desire, and a love for God's Word in the hearts of high school students. The competition aspect is provided simply to have fun with the studied and learned information.

Youth Speakers Tournament – grades 10th, 11th and 12th – Youth are encouraged in their growth towards Chistlikeness. Youth Speakers Tournament helps teenagers express their faith verbally, develop poise and confidence, develop skills to articulate truth in a way that people will hear and understand, and prepares teenagers to stand for Christ in their churches, at school, in their work places, and communities.
