Pastor's Heart

Happy Father's Day to all you dads and granddads.

As I write this column, I am in Indianapolis preparing to board a plane for Chicago and then on to Berlin, Germany. As you read this, I am engaged in a meeting with Baptist leaders in Europe working on partnerships for missions.

Anytime I write this column on the road, knowing that airline travel stands between you and me, I am conscious of my mortality. I am neither morbid nor fearful, just conscious of the fact that "what goes up must come down."

So when I write a column from far away there is always the passing thought that it may be read after I have arrived in heaven. The thought does not usually change the column significantly but it always changes my approach. (You just know that someone is going to quote your "last words".) With a Father's Day column it really comes into play.

What would I want you to remember if this were my final Father's Day Pastor's Heart? Simply that fathers carry the responsibility of leading their children to Jesus: of leading them to salvation and godly character.

Dads, children watch you and follow you - whether you want them to or not. We mirror to our children a concept of our Heavenly Father (even if a distorted one). Father's Day needs to be a day of renewal in our commitment to personally know and follow Jesus. Perfection is not required, but a genuine

The reality is that none of us is promised another Father's Day or another Monday, etc. All of our words may be our final ones. Each day may mark the last day that we can show our children what is really important in life and eternity. It's important that our children see genuine Christian character and a genuine love for the Lord in our lives.

So, if by chance these are my last words, let it be known that I love my children and let it be said that I loved them enough to point them to Jesus as their primary allegiance in life. I do this imperfectly, but as they know, I do it genuinely. Jesus is neither my 'religion' nor my 'job'; He is my life, my Savior, my
