Today is the fifth Sunday of August. For many years First Baptist Church has sponsored a food drive to assist needy persons in Cookeville and the surrounding area on the fifth Sunday on the calendar. In January our church voted to join a collaboration of churches dedicated to meeting physical and spiritual needs in our community. I felt that on this fifth Sunday, I would share with you some of the recent statistics from the Care Center. Through July 31 the Care Center has:

Received 2,015 client applications Served 6,025 people Fed 5,558 Distributed 2,191 boxes of food Assisted with Rent, Utilities, and Gasoline

Prior to the start of school, the Care Center sponsored a drive to provide haircuts and book bags for children. This year approximately 275 children were provided with needed school supplies and a fresh haircut to enable them to begin their studies this year.

These statistics show a wonderful, caring ministry to meet physical needs. The more wonderful statistic is that during these seven months, fifty one people have prayed to receive Christ as Savior and Lord. Lives are being touched, lives are being changed, and we are given opportunity to Engage in ministry through the Care Center Ministry. As with all ministries, volunteers are constantly needed to continue to meet the physical and spiritual needs.
