Pastor's Heart

We have a new President-elect. What now?

Whether you are pleased with the outcome, dissatisfied, angry, delighted, at peace, or fearful, as a believer you have clear mandates from God's word concerning your response to the

First: Pray for the President. The scripture is clear on this. 1 Timothy 2:1-3 says, "First of all, then, I urge that entreaties and prayers, petitions and thanksgivings, be made on behalf of all men, for kings and all who are in authority, so that we may lead a tranquil and quiet life in all godliness and dignity. This is good and acceptable in the sight of God our Savior." Pray then for President-elect Obama. Ask God to lead him, protect him, and grant him wisdom.

Many rulers have failed because of the advisors with which they surrounded themselves. Pray that President Obama will choose wise and good advisors, people of integrity and understanding. Pray that those who influence the president will be led of the Lord. Where he is wrong, pray God will send those to effectively confront him. Where he is correct, pray that God will send many to encourage him.

Second: Trust in the Lord. God is in control as much today as yesterday, as much this year as in years past. Romans 8:28 is God's word and God's promise. God's providence prevails and He often uses unlikely people to bring about His purposes. I strongly disagree with many of the moral positions taken by our government and our courts. Abortion is a sinful tragedy of unimaginable proportions. Gay marriage is an abomination. These are not political positions for me, but Biblical ones.

Yet, God knows our nation and our ruler's hearts. Where I may have little or no control, He is in control. Proverbs reminds us, "The king's heart is like channels of water in the hand of the LORD; He turns it wherever He wishes." (Proverbs 21:1)

Third: Submit unto the government's authority. Romans 13:1 reminds us that we are to be subject to our government seeing it as "established by God." This does not mean that everything the government does is correct nor that we are to place our submission to government above our submission to God's word, but it does mean that we are to walk under the government's authority unless it conflicts with the word of God. Jesus said, "Then render to Caesar the things that are Caesar's, and to God the things that are God's." (Luke 20:25)

Four: Honor the new president. This may be hard for some but again the scriptures are clear. "Submit yourselves for the Lord's sake to every human institution, whether to a king as the one in authority, or to governors as sent by him for the punishment of evildoers and the praise of those who do right. For such is the will of God that by doing right you may silence the ignorance of foolish men. Act as free men, and do not use your freedom as a covering for evil, but use it as bondslaves of God. Honor all people, love the brotherhood, fear God, honor the king." (1Peter 2:13-17)

Watch your words, your jokes, your remarks to one another. The Lord is
