

These statistics tell us a lot about our church and ministry.

One: We are a large church. The average Baptist church has less than a hundred in Sunday School. We average well over five times that number. And on 'good' Sundays we swell to far more than that. Only a large church can have twenty-eight funerals in one year and still have 'church'.

That means that we are multi-staffed, with multiple ministries, and multiple responsibilities. It is impossible to do the things we do and live by the expectations of a smaller single staff church. Everyone must pitch in and minister to one another. Everyone must joyously serve. We struggle greatly if we expect someone else to do what all of us must do.

We are a church that has multiple staff and deacons because one pastor simply cannot meet the needs of a congregation such as our beloved family. Like other larger organizations, we have specialized areas of service so that we can make sure needs are met. Youth, children, adults, outreach, music, and the preaching of the word are divided between ministerial staff, so that all can be done well, not so that each can be done by multiple peo-

Two: We are a diverse church strategically reaching people of all ages. Unlike some churches that are made up primarily of one age group, we are a church with babies, children, youth, young adults and seniors. I like that. It gives us the health of a real family with parents and grandparents in the Lord.

It also brings the struggles of all ages into our view. We strive to be balanced and diverse in our music, our ministries, and our emphases. We must be, of necessity, healthily understanding of each other. Every member needs to participate in the ministries and outreach efforts that target all ages.

Three: We must strive to grow in every way and in every area. In the last few years we have graduated to heaven more members than most churches have on role. These have been great men and women of God who at one time led our church in attendance, giving, and spiritual health. Now, others must take their place.

That means that each member must take his or her place in regular attendance, giving, and serving the Lord. We cannot depend upon others to teach our children, lead our Sunday School or give to the Kingdom's work. Each member must step up and lead the

We must be reaching new families for Christ and His Church. We cannot think that the church will be healthy if we are not reaching for new members of all ages.

You know the number one reason most people join any church continues to be because someone personally (friend, family member, or coworker) invites them to join in attendance.

Funerals are hard, particularly when they come as they have in the last few years. But they are not bad. A Christian is headed to heaven and an opening for ministry is spotlighted for you in God's church.

# Chí Rho Youth Choir on the move

The Chi Rho Youth Choir is leading in worship tonight. In addition to leading some hymns, the choir will sing two new anthems which they learned for this year's Youth Project. A fellowship for youth choir participants will be held tonight following the evening service.

Last weekend Chi Rho joined more than 500 other youth for Youth Project 2009 in Jackson, Tennessee. The two-day festival was sponsored by Union University



and the Tennessee Baptist Convention. The event included time for worship, recreation, and rehearsal. It concluded with all of the participants singing together on a recording which will be released later this spring.

The CD will feature the premiere recording of an African song entitled "Mohla Jesu a boa" which was arranged for the event by Dr. Chris Matthews. Dr. Matthews led the rehearsals last weekend and he chairs the music department at Union.

The Youth Project is just one of three annual events in which Chi Rho participates. The first was the fall retreat and the last one will be the summer mission tour which begins on June 6. Chi Rho is planning a trip to the Blue Ridge Mountains of North Carolina this June for a week of concerts focusing on ministry and evangelism. Carra McNelly assists with choir administration each week. She comments, "This year's trip will be another great opportunity to bring glory to the Lord as we minister to others. I hope that all of our singers can participate.

In regard to the cost of the trip Director Jonathan Nelms adds, "Although we will save some money because we are not traveling as far as in recent years, I still anticipate the cost of the summer mission tour to be about \$300 per person. This may be difficult for some families in our declining economy, but I hope that others in our congregation will be able to help sponsor youth participants by providing financial assistance."

Chi Rho will be singing in the worship service next Sunday evening, February 15, as well. The choir is open to all youth in grades seven through twelve. Rehearsals are held each Wednesday at 5:00 p.m. in the choir room. More information about the choir as well as photos of recent events can be found on the Chi Rho blog at http://xpyc.blogspot.com/.
