Pastor's Heart

I hope that you have had the sure sense that God was directing, clearly directing, something that you were a part of. This week I have had the joy of just such intuition. Seldom have I delighted more to see God work out His plan and direction. It has been a great week for mission and kingdom.

When I arrived to preach last Sunday in Berlin, after I gathered myself for the service, I entered the sanctuary at the International Baptist Church and was greeted by Lee Bryant's daughter and grandson. What a delight to have the daughter of a FBC Cookeville member meet me in Berlin. Thank you Lee for telling them to make sure and come hear Pastor Randy!

Along with the international crowd of worshippers there were four Georgia girls in the congregation and a Campus Crusade for Christ volunteer who works at a summer camp in McMinnville. So you can imagine I was feeling like whistling, "It's a Small World After All."

God began opening doors as I ate with the head of foreign missions for the Evangelical Free Church in Germany and shared of our teams working with local churches to share the Gospel. It was one of those "God moments" on Tuesday morning.

But God was only beginning. On Wednesday the Pastor of the International Church and I began to envision ways that FBC and IBC might share in reciprocal missions. Many of the Germans who are members of IBC, along with other nationalities, actually came to Christ while living with Baptist families as exchange students in America. When they returned to Germany they became involved with this English-speaking congregation to grow in their walk.

Now wouldn't it be great to send some of our people to Germany to help them grow their church and have them come to Cookeville to highlight and help us in reaching our town? I am excited by the prospect of us working with both the International Baptist Church and with the German Baptist Church with which they share a building.

There's more. I had worked out a meeting with our International Mission Board missionaries for Thursday at lunch. This couple is in Germany with a specific calling to reach the Turkish community. Unfortunately, they had not yet met the pastor of IBC. So I was able to bring these two ministries together.

Wow! When I finally met the missionaries and we began to talk, I found that they were a family that had served my former church in Monroeville, Alabama in youth ministry before coming on the mission field. They were at FBC Monroeville for three years after I had come to Cookeville. What's that tune again? "It's a Small World After All!"

OK, OK, this is getting too long, but suffice it to say that the two ministries in Berlin are now partnering in a specific missions outreach because God led me to go to Berlin. What is more, I believe God is leading us to partner with them.

Pray with me as we ask God what all of this should become in the months ahead. The IMB couple will be in the states in a few months on sabbatical and can share their mission at our church. The International Church would like to plan a partnership mission with us for sometime next year. What will God have you to do? See you soon in worship.
