Holy Week Worship Opportunities

Holy Week begins today, April 5, with Palm Sunday and concludes with Easter. Throughout this week there are many unique opportunities for worship. The following is an overview.

Palm Sunday, April 5. Today we remember Jesus' triumphal final entry into Jerusalem. Musical selections and scripture readings will be celebratory yet will foreshadow the passion that is yet to come. The Heart Strings Harp Ensemble will be playing during the service.

Easter Sunday, April 12. Both morning worship services will feature thrilling music and meaningful sermons celebrating the Resurrection. The Sanctuary Choir and Orchestra will be participating in both morning worship services at 8:15 and 10:45 a.m. Each service will conclude with a Handel's triumphant "Hallelujah Chorus."
