The election of deacons has been sporadic at First Baptist. Since our deacons voted more than 10 years ago to move from a rotation of service to a permanent appointment, the election process has been held "as needed." Since then elections, along with worship services devoted to deacon ordination and commitment, have hap-

pened only every few years.

With that schedule it is easy to forget both the process and its importance. This year we will receive deacon nominations and have an election. The process will begin in May with nominations received from the congregation, and the ordination/ deacon commitment service is scheduled for the fall. Between those dates, you will have the opportunity to pray, nominate, and elect qualified men to serve as deacon ministers in our church.

The deacons have asked me to preach this morning on those qualifications. The source of the message (as always) will be the Bible, with some further insight from our congregation's Deacon Manual. For your consideration, the most prominent passages on deacons are found in Acts 6 and 1 Timothy 3.

In May, the Deacon Nominating Committee will receive nominations from the congregation. Forms will be made available in a few weeks. They will then walk through the process of qualifying and bringing to you a slate of men for election. All of this will be done as outlined in the Deacon Manual of the church.

This is a holy process. Those chosen should be nominated because they meet the requirements of scripture and have a deep desire to serve in the manner the church has outlined. Deacons should not be chosen based upon popularity, in order to get someone who is uninvolved involved, to bestow honor and recognition on someone, or because they have been a friend for a long time. Rather, nomination and election should be based upon a man's clear walk with the Lord, evident spiritfilled temperament, his godly wisdom, biblical knowledge, and his commitment to minister as the church has outlined.

Let's pray together, study God's word, and seek the Lord's wisdom as we move through this process.
