Youth Choir Tour begins Saturday

This morning we will be commissioning our summer mission trip participants. Among these are the Chi Rho Youth Choir members who will be departing this Saturday, June 6, for Asheville, North Carolina. This choir for youth in grades 7 through 12 takes a mission and concert tour each June. Like previous years,

the choir will be traveling to a central location, Asheville, and visiting concert and ministry venues in that area. Fifty-five youth and chaperones will be participating in this year's tour which includes a wide variety of activities.

The choir will visit Pritchard Park in downtown Asheville this Saturday evening. This event will consist of singing and street evangelism. The printed tour program includes information about the choir, the songs they sing, and the plan of salvation. Choir Director Jonathan Nelms observes, "People are drawn to the choir and they are glad to receive a printed program. Then, during our performance, I refer to the back of the program which includes the plan of salvation under the heading 'Why We Sing.' We have found this to be a great way to share the good news of Jesus Christ."

On Sunday, Chi Rho will be leading worship in two churches, Grace Baptist in the morning and Newbridge Baptist in the evening. The churches will be feeding the choir and sharing in fellowships which will include a game of softball after the evening ser-

Each evening all of the tour participants will gather around the hotel swimming pool for worship, testimonies, a devotional thought, and prayer. This is also the time that the Goober Stick and the Glory Stick are presented to the worthy recipients.

The plans for Monday include serving meals at the Veterans' Restoration Quarters which houses 110 homeless veterans. As always the choir will sing a concert and share the gospel as well. In the afternoon the youth will enjoy a picnic at Lake Powhattan and tour the North Carolina Arboretum. In the evening they will visit the Fun Depot for some recreation.

Tuesday finds the choir singing at the Western North Carolina Baptist Retirement Home, a large assisted living facility. The choir will serve refreshments to the residents before departing for the Battery Park Apartments in downtown Asheville. Chi Rho will eat lunch at a large subsidized housing development for senior adults and then present another program and serve more refreshments.

Billy Graham operates a training facility in Asheville called The Cove. The youth will tour The Cove and present a concert in its Chatlos Memorial Chapel on Wednesday morning. After the concert they will eat lunch at the VA Hospital and sing for the veterans in the nursing home portion of the facility. This will include a hospice unit and an Alzheimer's care unit.

After a brief visit to the Folk Art Center on the Blue Ridge Parkway, the choir will eat supper and sing a concert at the Grassy Branch Baptist Church. The evening program will also include an IMB missionary from China.

On Thursday morning, the choir will sing for the residents at the Eliada Academy for foster children. This Christian based organization houses children and youth who are unable to live with their families or have no families. All of the students and staff will attend a program by Chi Rho which will conclude with a question and answer portion regarding music and faith. In the evening the youth choir will return to the Veterans' Restoration Quarters to help with the evening meal and to sing another program.

The youth will travel through Maggie Valley on the way home and visit the Ghost

Town in the Sky. After some fun and some food at this old-time amusement park, the choir should return to Cookeville in time for supper.

Chi Rho Tour 2009 will present many opportunities for ministry and outreach. Pray not only for a safe choir trip, but an effective time of spiritual growth for each of the participants.
