Nelms launch new website

The site includes simple steps to beginning a private prayer life. Jonathan observes, "We live in a busy culture that often keeps us from learning how to deal with life and the struggles all of us face. Glenda and I want this website to be an easy way for Christians to get started on a simple plan for individual and family worship." Tools4worship.com also provides academic resources for teachers, pastors, and other church leaders who want to study the importance of worship renewal on a corporate level.

The Tennessee Baptist Convention has recognized the need for training even vocational worship leaders in the discipline of personal worship. Jonathan will be teaching a seminar at Englewood Baptist Church in Jackson tomorrow that will focus on the importance of personal piety in the lives of ministers.
