As we focus on God's word concerning God's church we cannot neglect the direct application of Hebrews 10:25: "not forsaking our

own assembling together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another; and all the more as you see the day drawing near."

We continue this week looking at the wonderful plan of God for His church. Focusing upon what it means to be a healthy fellowship filled with growing, maturing believers. 


Obviously Haiti will need long-term help. As specific opportunities arise, Tennes-
