Pastor's Heart

I affirm to you that it will change everything and change it for the best. What am I speaking of? Your adopting of one overarching principle for life. That principle is embodied in this simple question: "How can I in this present situation best honor and glorify God?"

Whether speaking of your interaction with your spouse or other family members, or with a member of your church family, even in

business situations and public confrontations this should be your purpose. After all it is the purpose for which you were created: To honor and glorify

This then is our goal. Let's adopt it together as maturing, healthy believers. Before we speak, when we are agitated, certainly as we worship and when we are joyous (of course it's not so hard then), when we face decisions, when we perceive that we have been wronged or we are confronted with someone who feels we have wronged them -- be the first to determine that you, for your part, will do in the present moment that which will honor and glorify God.

Of course, such an attitude is biblical and Christ honoring upon its face. Who then gets to determine what it is that glorifies and honors God? God does. He reveals it in His word. So, in the midst of any situation, let the word of God saturate you and guide you. Ask yourself, "What at this moment is the word instructing me to do?" Most often the word will instruct your attitude, then your words, and then your actions.

We had a great teachers meeting on Wednesday night discussing the material that every class from youth through adults will be working through in March, April, and May. The material is derived primarily from the study. What is a Healthy Church Member? It is Sunday School material designed to go hand in hand with the series of sermons I have been preaching in our series Healthy Christians/Healthy Church.

We echo the theme of the Apostle to the Ephesians: "to the building up of the body of Christ; until we all attain to the unity of the faith, and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to a mature man, to the measure of the stature which belongs to the fullness of Christ." Such is a healthy Christian in a healthy

A further word on relationships. It is my prayer that during this period of March through May every member in our congregation will join in a small group, as we did when we worked through the Purpose Driven Life study, to learn the principles of biblical peacemaking. We certainly need hosts and facilitators to make this happen and if you would be willing to volunteer for such a role, please let me know.

We will be studying materials designed by Peacemaker Ministries that lead us through the biblical call to peace and the personal application of making peace in our lives, families, and church. It will be a great and beneficial time. I promise.

Choir president Jackie Donaldson explains, "First, we need to enlist




enough singers before the end of February. Second, we need to sell at least 400 CD's by the end of March. If we can do those two things, then we will move ahead with the
