
There will be groups meeting on Sunday evenings, other nights during the week, and during the daytime hours. Many of the groups will be led by our deacons, but others will be leading as well.

May is right around the corner and we are going to Mackinac Island for two nights at the Grand Hotel and then to Holland, Michigan to see the


