emphases. There will be materials for use in the Resource Center as well as to check out or purchase. This is going to be a great visual, practical, and spiritual resource for our congregation.

I appreciate all of the hard work going into the center, much of it volunteer. Special funds have been given for use in the project. So as an added blessing, we do not have to use budget funds to bring the center to completion. I pray it will be a much used and much appreciated place for facilitating your spiritual growth and health.

There is great participation in our *Peacemaker* study groups. In fact several of the groups have gone well beyond the designation "small" groups.

Let me makes some suggestions. Now that you see how easy it is to facilitate a group. Perhaps your group would want to split into two separate groups allowing one of the members to simply facilitate the second group for the last six weeks.

Alternately, you might stick with one facilitator but during the discussion time take a question and divide up for a few minutes into groups of 4 to 6 for short discussions then come back to the larger group for closing or reporting.

I know questions arise as you do the study that may not be answered in that day's lesson. Let me encourage you to hold those, write them down, and see if they are not dealt with in subsequent sessions.

It is important to focus on the personal application to your life of the principles presented in each lesson. Don't miss that application by getting ahead or focusing on other issues. Help your facilitator in that way.
