Pastor's Heart

Bad luck? Good luck? God's work?

Tsutomu Yamaguchi died this year in January at 93 years of age. Yamaguchi had the misfortune to be called to Hiroshima on a business trip on August 6, 1945. That was the day that the US dropped the first Atomic Bomb on that

Somehow he survived. He returned to his hometown with a story very few lived to tell. Unfortunately, his hometown was Nagasaki, Japan and there three days later on August 9, 1945 the US dropped a second Atomic Bomb.

What a distinction Yamaguchi would carry for the rest of his life. He was one of very few to survive having been in both cities where an atomic bomb was detonated.

He served as an interpreter for the US troops when they occupied Japan and after the war he became a junior high school teacher. (A profession some here today would testify is as tough as surviving an atomic bomb.) In later life he spoke before the United Nations and wrote books and songs about his experiences.

Yamaguchi became a story teller. He made a life of sharing the experiences of his life.

The story reminds me of two facts. One, God has a plan for our lives and until that plan is complete nothing and nobody (not even an atomic bomb) can take our lives from us. Such knowledge should not lead us to foolish risk-taking but to confident and fearless living. Your life is in God's
