Our church voted over two years ago to join a collaboration of churches dedicated to meeting physical and spiritual needs in our community. I felt that as we approach this fifth Sunday, I would share with you some of the recent statistics from the Care Center. For the year ending December 31, 2010, the Care Center has:

- Received 4,214 client applications
- ♦ Served 12,886 people

- ♦ Fed 11.556
- Distributed 4,502 boxes of food
- Assisted with Rent, Utilities, and Gasoline

These statistics show a wonderful, caring ministry to meet physical needs. The more wonderful statistic is that during this past year, 99 people have prayed to receive Christ as Savior and Lord.
