Thank you for all you did to make VBS a great success. Now let me remind you to continue your summer of engaging in missions by being active in giving and going for the Kingdom.

Speaking of giving. Last week as we focused upon the command of Mark 9 to "listen to Him," we noted that there are two clear commands in God's word that believers simply tend to ignore. They ignore them to the loss of their blessings, their family's well being, and their nation's prosperity. These commands are found in Malachi 3 and Matthew 28:19.

Malachi 3:7-10 tells us that if we fail to be good stewards of the tithe (10%) of the Lord, then we are robbers and thieves of the Kingdom. These are not my words. I would not dare, of my own initiative, designate you or another as a thief, but these are God's words to you.

We were reminded of the oft quoted passage in 2 Chronicles 7:14, "If My people who are called by My name humble themselves and pray and seek My face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, will forgive their sin and will heal their land."

When I see those two passage brought together, I cannot help but connect the dots of our nation's recession with the disobedience of God's people. According to statistics, 76% of all evangelical Christians do not tithe. Of selfdesignated "born again Christians" only 9% give a tithe of their income.

Those "called by My name" may be praying for revival, but there is not power in their prayers because they are not turning (repenting) and humbly obeying the word of the Lord.

God desires to bless those who "listen to Him!"

Is your family, your church, your nation, and God's Kingdom suffering because you are not listening? Believing? Obeying?

Could it be that we are hearing the resounding thunder of God's voice, "You are cursed with a curse, for you are robbing Me, the whole nation of


