Celebrate Recovery

Mark Clapp, M.D., will be leading our Celebrate Recovery class beginning Monday at 6 p.m. in Room 143. Here is his testimony of how he began teaching Celebrate Recovery.

How did a guy with no history of alcohol use, or drug addiction find himself teaching Celebrate Recovery? I was sick and tired of signing death certificates. People were dying in Jamestown every week of overdose and I knew a lot of them. I was County Medical Examiner and every signature was a reminder of the great need. God called me to help in my weakness and inadequacy.

What kept me going was seeing how greatly I was personally effected by the 12 Steps taught in Celebrate Recovery. The lives that were changed were wonderful. The change in my own life was glorious. We all have sin in our lives, character defects, resentments, a need for confession and making amends that qualifies us for the program. Alcoholics need God's grace in a mighty way. Drug addicts need God's grace in a mighty way. I need God's grace in a mighty way. Don't you need to experience God's grace? The 12 steps have their foundation with a Christian program called the Oxford Group. It was not a chemical dependency program but a way to restore people to God. Through the 12 step program I have been restored. I have learned the power of honesty, confession and accountability. I have also seen the destructive side of hidden sin, dishonesty and denial.

Come share with us and see if we can help each other on this journey of grace, forgiveness and joy.


