It's easy to lose Jesus in Christmas. The hurried and harried preparations. The emphasis upon family time or the disappointments that intermingle with family activities. Even the special preparations for church events. All of these can conspire to rob Jesus of this season.

It takes focused attention and intentional choice to make the celebration and worship of Jesus the center of this season. We do so at the Adkisson home by making sure that the Bible story is the first thing celebrated on Christmas morning. But we also do it by reminding each other where the true meaning of Christmas resides: in the manger and on the cross.

By the way, it doesn't mess with my joy if someone says, "Happy Holidays" to me. After all it is a holiday time, between Thanksgiving and the New Year. Now, I plan to say "Merry Christmas" to everyone. But I will show the love of Christ by saying, "Happy Hanukkah" to my Jewish friends. Even, Happy Kwanzaa to my African American friends, if they celebrate that season. My prayer for all is a happy and blessed New Year.

I strongly believe that if we will show the love of Jesus to everyone around us instead of wearing our pet peeves upon our shoulders we will bear fruitful witness to the real reason for this season. Oh, go ahead and graciously share with a store manager that you'd rather hear "Merry Christmas" and that you don't want the significance of the season hidden. But show grace and kindness to all who wish you well. That's the Christian thing to do.

On a different note: Are you an angel? Have you ever met one? That will be our focus this morning. And next week we will meet a very special Angel in the pages of God's word. So don't miss either emphasis.

The word says, "Let love of the brethren continue. Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for by this some have entertained angels without knowing it." (Hebrews 13:1–2)
