Corinthians 1:3-5:

When they are troubled, we will be able to give them the same comfort God has given us. For the more we suffer for Christ, the more God will shower us with his comfort through Christ.ö

This verse reminds us that our struggles often become the basis for our ministries. Where has God led you and what has God led you through? Look to that place as a place of significance through which God has gifted you and now desires to use you in ministry to others. Understand the comfort that He has brought to you is as well the comfort that He now seeks to offer through you.

Have you ever eaten food prepared at First Baptist Church whether in the building or elsewhere? It is


a ministry that touches many lives in our
