Pastor's Heart



Immortality is nothing new. It has plagued the earth almost from the beginning of time. Though variously defined, immortality is anything that departs from the standard of morality set by God and revealed in God's Word.

For a believer, morality cannot be defined by the cultural standards around us but must be defined by the Word of God. Today many people are confused, conflicted, and consumed by immorality. This is true of the world in which we live and the churches in which we worship.

This morning we will look directly into God's Word to define and confront immorality in our midst and in our lives. Such confrontation is not a negative matter, any more than the diagnosis of disease is a negative matter. Biblical clarity will help us steer a course of safety and salvation. Such is absolutely necessary for successful living, worship, and parenting.

God sent His Son into the world to save immoral people, just like you and me. His redemption is just as powerful today, as on the first day of its provision. So join me this morning in understanding God's heart in the matter, in hearing God's voice in the matter, and in offering God's redemption in the matter of immorality.

"Do not be deceived; neither fornicators, nor idolaters, nor adulterers, nor effeminate, nor homosexuals, nor thieves, nor the covetous, nor drunkards, nor revilers, nor swindlers, will inherit the kingdom of God. Such were some of you; but you were washed, but you were sanctified, but you were justified in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ and in the Spirit of our God." (1 Corinthians 6:9-11)

"Flee immorality. Every other sin that a man commits is outside the body, but the immoral man sins against his own body." (1 Corinthians 6:18)

This meeting is to consider extending the current budget through Sept. 30 to give all the personnel and stewardship committees time to work out details of ministerial staff positions.

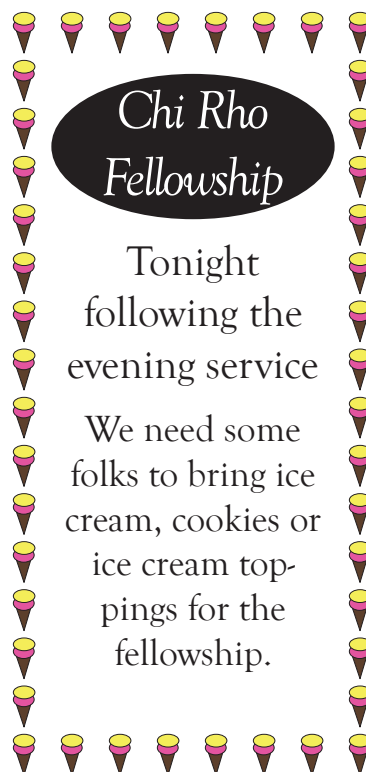
[How Can We Help You?]

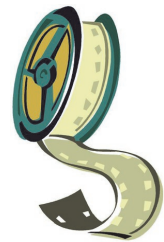
