Monday

Acts 2:17 'It shall be in the last days, that I will pour forth of My Spirit upon all mankind; And your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, And your young men shall see visions, And your old men shall dream dreams.

Excitingly, God is gifting His people for active, vital, purposeful ministry. He is calling on men and women, young and old, to be engaged in His plan of salvation and mission.
